Greetings Woodrock,

Welcome to Spring in the CO mountains!

Fire Danger:

It's the time of year that we need to stay aware of the fire dangers in our area. The National Weather Service issues red flag warnings and the notice will appear on the Teller County sheriffs and office of emergency management website. In recent weeks, we have had several orange and red flag warnings and need to stay vigilant.

Because of extreme fire danger, please observe the Woodrock **NO OPEN FIRES** regulation and be especially watchful for activity of this kind. You can view this information on the Woodrock website at <u>https://www.woodrock-poa.org/</u>

Mitigation:

We are in the que for chipping and shredding with the Divide Fire Department again this year. Once we have more details, we will send out another email. It is never too early to start mitigating your property in preparation for chipper day.

Plan to have your slash piles alongside the road, thick ends pointing out toward the road and piled no more than five feet tall <u>(see attached photo for example)</u>. Piles located on driveways will not be chipped.

If you have tree branches that are hanging into the road way, please trim them back for the safety of our community and high profile vehicles.

New this year: firewood size material should be set aside and not chipped but put out for general availability. We have many homeowners that would appreciate having this firewood for home heating purposes.

Wildlife Reminder:

Wildlife is returning and that includes trash loving raccoons, magpies, and bears. Please do your part in making your trash inaccessible except on pick-up days. If your trash does not get picked up, please call your service provider and bring your trash back in. The less opportunity we give the animals to scavenge the better for them and us.

Speeding and Safety:

The speed limit in Woodrock is 20mph.

Please drive in your lane and never drive faster than your braking distance, especially on curves.

A good rule of thumb when driving on dirt roads is that the vehicle coming uphill has the right of way so that they don't lose momentum. During inclement weather and icy road conditions we would recommend keeping this in mind as a kindness to each other.

If you are coming downhill in a narrow area of our roads, please give the right of way to the vehicle coming uphill. If you stop, please pull as safely to the side as possible for the oncoming vehicle. It is far easier for the vehicle heading downhill to get moving again.

Protecting a Privilege:

Around mid-February 2025 there was trespassing on the Myrick family private property (see attached picture showing tire tracks in the snow which led to their private pond).

As you near the gate for the Woodrock Fishing Club you will notice a new "PRIVATE PROPERTY / NO TRESPASSING" sign on the left-hand side of the road (see attachment). Woodrock residents are only allowed to use and visit the acreage around and behind the ponds, of which access is the gate to the right of the Woodrock Fishing Club sign. We need to be respectful of the Myrick property and not venture past the new sign, which includes the homestead and their private pond.

The Myrick family is very generous with allowing Woodrock residents the use of their land and we don't want to lose that privilege. If you are unsure of where you are allowed to visit, please reach out to us.

WPOA Annual Meeting and Picnic

Mark your calendars, the WPOA Annual Meeting and Picnic will be held on August 10th. We have a lot of information to share and we look forward to seeing you there. Details will be sent out at a later date.

Election for the Board of Directors 2024/2025

There will be an open position on the WPOA Board of Directors for the 2024/2025 fiscal year. If you are interested in joining the Board, send an email to (<u>WoodrockPOA@gmail.com</u>) by June 23rd to get on the ballot. Elections will be in early July.

Assessment Increase

The annual assessments will be increasing by 10% from \$300 per lot to \$330 per lot. The Board used a probability study to determine how much the annual assessments will be increasing. That information will be made available to all the members as an attachment to the annual budget at the August meeting. Woodrock Meeting Minutes from 2001 stated an assessment of \$227. That would be \$400 in today's market.

Over the last seven years income has totaled \$203,268 and expenditures \$235,633 for a deficit of \$32,365. Spread over seven years would be a \$4,624 shortfall or \$48.17 per lot, per year. We felt a \$30 increase would be sufficient. A discussion on WPOA monetary reserves will be given at the WPOA Annual Meeting and Picnic.

Gate Code Update

The new gate code (9428) has been active and working now for a few weeks. As of June 10th, the old code (4663) will be deleted. All major services have been notified. If you are a propane customer of AmeriGas or Ferrell gas, please call and inform them of the new code. Glaser gas has confirmed receipt of the new code.

Snow Plow Policy Change

After much thought and discussion the Board has reconsidered how we use the community snowplow and truck. Wear and tear on the community equipment and the time commitment on our drivers was stretched to the limit and we needed to reevaluate our community resources. After several incidents that could have left the community with no snow plowing capability; we

have decided to no longer plow driveways. The truck and plow are for clearing community property and driveways are private property, therefore, the responsibility of the property owner. By notifying everyone now this allows time to prepare and plan for next winter.

The Fire Chief with the Divide Fire Protection District has notified us that the first chipper days are scheduled for the 19th-22nd of June. They are hoping to make it to our area sometime in the later part of the week. Once we have more details we will send out another email. It is never too early to start mitigating your property in preparation for chipper day.

In the near future the cattle will be moved in to graze for the summer in the acreage around the ponds. Typically there are approximately 20 pairs (a heifer and her calf) but it can vary. Please remember to follow gate etiquette beginning now and into the fall for both green gates. For new residents, the first gate is the entry to the ponds and the second is past the ponds going back up into the neighborhood. If the gate is open leave it open, if the gate is closed please close it behind you once you've gone through it. The gates will be closed once the cattle have arrived for the season. If we follow this simple technique we shouldn't have any issues with the cattle getting out.

Bear SEASON is in full swing and they are active in the community. Be aware and alert as it is possible that we also have cubs in the neighborhood and you never want to get between a mama bear and her cub. For that matter, this applies to all wildlife.

Also in regards to the bears, please keep your trash secured at your house until the morning of trash pickup. There have been several instances of trash cans being broken into by the bears and trash scattered and blowing around the neighborhood. The less opportunity we give the bears to scavenge the better for them and us.

Maybe if the drivers see enough of these notices, they will get the information back to management. Also if you place an order with Amazon, Wayfair or other home delivery service please make a comment in the delivery instructions that the gate code is 9428.

This week is a good time to start mitigating your land. Soon we'll be notified of the chipper/shredder coming to Woodrock to chew up your slash piles. If you have plans to take down some trees, now is a good time to start.

Stay tuned for further information regarding volunteering for the neighborhood Poop Patrol Pickup event. This event does not mean as a neighborhood we condone not picking up after your pets. You know who you are and so do your neighbors. Please be a good neighbor and pick up after your pets.

The Board is interested in knowing your interest in getting a 20 yard roll-off dumpster for use by the residents to get rid of large objects that the trash service would not pick up. Some restrictions

are no mattresses, appliances, TV's, tires, hazardous materials, construction materials and NO SLASH. The roll-off would be placed down by the gate and the estimated cost is \$400 for a week. We want this to be equitable to all homeowners and we are trying to gauge your interest and participation. Please reply to this email if you wish to participate.

Woodrock has previously used Mountain Tree Spraying/Jake McNeese of Woodland Park to spray for

budworms, generally on an every other year basis. In 2022 the charge was \$10 per tree. He is quoting

If there is a residence on site, they move out from the home in a radius until number of trees is reached.

Realize this is a boom sprayer that goes quite high, hitting the largest trees but there is obviously

overspray that will catch smaller trees beneath. You are not paying for the smaller trees.

Billing can be by e-mail to your address in the directory. Alternatively, you can provide a completed

check made out to Mountain Tree Spraying for the number of trees requested, giving that check to Dale

Peterson who will pass it on to MTS when spraying is complete.

If you are interested in having this done, please reply as soon as possible and provide the following

information:

Lot number or numbers and address

Number of trees you want sprayed per lot (typically 15 to 30 trees per lot)

Any specific instructions for spraying on your lot – such as, you will mark specific trees with a colored

Greeting Woodrock,

As you are all aware, Teller County is in a State of Emergency, and that includes Woodrock. We just endured a historical storm and we should give thanks to our road crew for the great work they provided during and after the storm.

The roads in/out are the top priority for safety reasons and that will continue to be the case. There will be no more plowing of driveways until the roads are safe, which includes making sure we have 2 lanes in/out of the neighborhood. If it takes three days to get the roads cleared then residents need to make their own plowing arrangements.

We understand that the roads are still problematic due to slush thawing and refreezing. This will continue indefinitely, therefore, travel at your own risk. If you do get stuck it is your responsibility to get unstuck.

We recommend limiting your travel in/out of the neighborhood. The conditions are not ideal so please consider rescheduling appointments and asking neighbors for assistance, i.e. errands and grocery pick ups.

Dear Woodrock residents and property owners,

During this year's Colorado Legislative Session, HB23-1105 was passed and signed into law. It creates a task force charged with reviewing matters such as, but not limited to, an association's fining authority and practices, foreclosure practices, communications with homeowners regarding processes and homeowners' rights and responsibilities, the way in which the association makes its governing documents, policies and rules and regulations available to the homeowners, and executive board actions regarding collection and legal activity against a homeowner. The task force will also look at homeowner complaints (as reported to the HOA Information and Resource Center and Homeowners' Advocacy Groups in Colorado), CCIOA, and other state and federal laws.

Simply put, HB23-1105 creates a method by which members of a Colorado HOA or POA who may have problems with, or questions for, their HOA or POA may go directly to the task force without having to contact their association first. Designations and appointments to the task force will occur before August 1, 2023.

If you have questions about the task force, please contact the HOA Information Office and Resource Center, which is a program of the Division of Real Estate. You may find more information about this program, including contact information, at the <u>HOA Center</u> of the Colorado Department of Regulatory Agencies.
